"My father was ten when the Second World War broke out in France. He told me many times about when he, his parents, and his brothers abandoned their belongings and piled up in a car to flee the German troops marching on Paris. Over the next six years, his family lost everything: their home, their livelihood, many of their loved ones, and their French citizenship. As Jews, they went into exile in their own homeland, driven there by French anti-Semitic laws. They lived under an assumed name, at the mercy of benevolent strangers, to escape roundups to concentration camps.

To call my father a *bon vivant* wouldn't do him justice. He reveled in earthly pleasures with a zeal that bordered on pathology. He was married four times (the third time to my mother), had more lovers than I would prefer to know, and fathered eight children, of which I was the last. He liked nothing better than anything displayed in vast quantities: a cheese platter didn't deserve its name if it wasn't larger than the table it was served on; dresses were to be purchased in racks. At restaurants, he was known for ordering the entire menu on behalf of his dinner guests, so he could pick from everyone's plate. He adored *L'Amérique*—where I had moved at the age of 19—for its unabashed embrace of consumerism, its gargantuan salad bars, the dizzying heights and prismatic offerings of its supermarket aisles.

On our transatlantic calls, my father mourned our separation, at once feverishly affectionate and exasperatingly narcissistic: the combination of the two made me miss him terribly and sigh with relief after we hung up. Putting an ocean between us was my way of sidestepping Papa's monolithic shadow, of ignoring his treatment of women, of admiring and loving him from a safe distance.

In prose as elegant as it is precise, by turns deeply moving and mischievously funny, Violaine Huisman draws a portrait of twentieth-century France through her father and his own father before him: Georges Huisman, a high-ranking, Jewish French official, who created the Cannes Film Festival before being persecuted by the Vichy regime. Capturing a world that belonged to "another generation" and yet whose towering presence can still be felt today, the novel serves as a powerful exploration of how personal and political histories collide.

Griffin Hurt is in over his head. His role as Peter Proton on the hit TV show *The Nuclear Family* .and the rigor of his studies at Boyd Prep on New York's Upper West Side—along with the increasingly compromising demands of his wrestling coach—have him teetering on the edge of collapse.

Pig explores themes of toxic female friendship and manipulation, bringing them together in a fresh and ultimately uplifting way.

Vale has an obsession she hasn't been able to share with anyone until now. Once, her lifelong love for pigs left her vulnerable to manipulation by her narcissistic best friend and housemate, Clara. As Vale steps into the world of other people, Clara tightens her grip: she isn't yet ready to let go of her favourite prey.

The novel begins with Vale attempting to get home on time from her job at a London bookshop to avoid upsetting Clara. She is stuck in a deadening routine of work and home, not allowed to socialize or follow her interests as her energies are taken up by Clara's needs. To self-soothe, Vale thinks about and researches everything there is to know about pigs.


A chance encounter at the bookshop leads to a book contract for Vale, whose extremely thorough knowledge of pigs impresses Marcus, an editor of new agricultural books. But Vale is struggling to balance her life: her book deadline means long writing sessions, her feelings for her new colleague Kai are getting harder to ignore, and she is desperate to keep all of this from Clara, who is becoming increasingly violent and controlling.

Vale has to decide whether to give herself up to a life of isolation with Clara, or embrace her new life as an author and explore her feelings for Kai.

When two beautiful and vivacious young German women show up at a village dance on Bastille Day in 1977, everything turns upside down. The village, where life is perfectly routine and inconsequential, is soon threatened by mystery—and danger. The arrival of these two women, Brunhilde and Mariella, sparks both fascination and suspicion among the villagers.

Why have these strangers, these foreigners, come to such a remote place? Are they spies? Criminals? Witches? Usually, the village's rhythms revolve around the animals and fields, and country life in these postwar years operates miles away from the tidal wave of modernity. However, their arrival provokes long-forgotten memories of the past and ignites anxieties of the present.

Wunderland Baby is based on the true story of a village in the depths of Cantal, the childhood home of Pauline Claviere's family. This novel was born from her investigation into why her mother left the village, and why others remained. Claviere captures the beauty and atmosphere of a quintessentially French region and the moment that defined the course of her family's life.

And it's up to her to make things right.
