
I realized that to survive in this new world, I would need cunning and high spirits. I would need a fairy tale.

The next morning, I began work on a second tale. And when I finished that story, another one was waiting to be told.


These three tales—THE NORENDY TALES—led me through a dark forest. They comforted me. They made me brave.
