#### Slave Compensation Act

Can you imagine being enslaved, and then when are finally free, your former owner gets paid BIG money for "cough" (boing their property' and you get nothing? So gross and unfair, right? You're the one who was enslaved Well, that is what the United Kingdom's 'Stave Compensation Act' of 1337 ddl. It paid HUGE money to slave owners, while the newly liberated people got zero. Nothing at all. Even more messed up? British taxpayers paid the compensation – and we were still paing this compensation until 2015

Many stately homes (almost one third of the National Trust properties) benefited from colonialism and slavery. Some were bought with the compensation money.
